NOTICE OF RACE

EVENT & ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The organising authority shall be The West Mersea Yacht Club in conjunction with the National 18 Class Association

1. RULES

The event will be governed by the following rules:

- 1.1 The rules as defined in the ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 This Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions. In the event of a conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions the latter will prevail.
- 1.3 The notation (DP) in a rule of the NOR or SI indicates that the penalty for breaching this rule is at the discretion of the protest committee

2. ADVERTISING & IDENTIFICATION

2.1 (DP) Boats may be required to display bow numbers and/or advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all National 18ft class dinghies. Entries may be made from the following fleets;
 - (a) Ultra: Morrison designed hull
 - (b) Ultimate: GRP hull built to 200kg hull weight rule or built to 250kg hull weight rule and lightened to below 250kg
 - (C) Penultimate: GRP hull built and still conforming to the 250kg rule.
 - (d) Classic: Wooden boats and such other boats as the organising authority may designate; in particular Chichester Harbour 18s and Brightlingsea One Designs.
- 3.2 The Boat Owners of National 18ft class dinghies shall be members of the National 18ft Class Association
- **3.3** Entrants in the Ultra fleet (Morrison designed hull) are required to hold a valid RYA National 18 Class Measurement Certificate
- **3.4** Eligible boats may enter by Sailracer on Line using the link *******. Entries will close at Noon on 8^{th} July 2018. Late entries up to 8 pm on Sunday 15th July 2018 will be subject to a surcharge of £40.

4. CLASSIFICATION

The ISAF Sailor Classification Code will not apply.

5. FEE

The entry fee per boat will be £175.00. Payment should be made in accordance with instructions on the entry form. There will be no entry on the day







6. SCHEDULE

- 6.2 There will be a briefing for competitors at 11.00am on Sunday 15th July
- 6.3 Races not sailed as scheduled, or anticipated to be affected by bad weather, may be rescheduled at the discretion of the race committee, which may include using the spare day. The procedure of rescheduling will be detailed in the sailing instructions.
- 6.4 It is anticipated that the Ultra design boats will start as a single group, and the Ultimate, Penultimate, classis, Chichester Harbour 18's and Brightlingsea One designs will start together

7. INSPECTION & MEASUREMENT

There will be no formal measurement process. All boats will be inspected by the Technical Committee at any time for compliance with Class rules in accordance with Rule 92

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available on line from 1st July 2018.

9. LOCATION

The sailing area is the River Blackwater Estuary

10. COURSES

- 10.1 Courses will be a mixture of windward-leeward and Triangular courses. Details will be in the Sailing Instructions.
- 10.2 The race target times will be 45 minutes for all classes

11. SCORING

- 11.1 The Low Point scoring system of RRS Appendix A4 will apply.
- 11.2 Four races are required to constitute a Regatta.
- 11.3 When fewer than eight races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 11.4 When eight or nine races have been completed a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 11.5 When ten or more races have been completed a boats score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst score.

12. BERTHING

(DP) Boats are to be stored ashore in the dinghy park location for the duration of the event with the exception of the Classic boats which may remain afloat and shall use the mooring they have been assigned.

13. SUPPORT BOATS

(DP) Support boats shall register at the Race Office during the registration period







14. RADIO COMMUNICATION

(DP) Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats.

15. Trophies

Details of the trophies to be awarded may be found in the Event Brochure.

16. RISK STATEMENT

- 16.1 Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."
- 16.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore:
 - c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
 - e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
 - f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
 - g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event

17. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 or €3,000,000 per event or the equivalent.

18. MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

18.1 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment or positioning equipment as specified by the organising authority
